Effective early learning programs focus on teaching that is intentional and engaging for young children. The Early Childhood Series was built around this concept of a "planful, purposeful, playful" classroom. What does such a classroom look like?

Planful: The teacher plans ahead for rich learning experiences—lessons, activities, and read alouds—based on expanding children's skills.

Purposeful: The teacher sets clear learning goals for each student and designs every activity for a greater purpose—building language, cognitive, and social skills that promote school readiness.

Playful: The teacher uses playful learning activities to engage children and encourage them to use new words.
